## **Chair of Governors' Annual Letter November 2017**

As you will know, towards the end of the summer term, Tongwynlais Primary School and Coryton Primary School distributed a consultation document on the proposed Federation of the two schools. The documents were given to all parents, carers and all other stakeholders, including the local authority. Following the summer holidays, we arranged a drop in session for anyone looking for more information and towards the end of September, we held public and staff meetings in both schools. Comments could also be submitted directly to the Local Authority with a closing date of 6<sup>th</sup> October. We are pleased to say that not one objection was received and, although we had just three parents attend the three meetings, the comments made by them, and others, were in support of the proposals. The joint committee of the governors met during October and prepared a report which was in favour of proceeding to Federation and this was approved, unanimously, by both governing bodies this Monday, 20<sup>th</sup> November. Tongwynlais and Coryton Primary Schools will now formally federate on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2018. We believe that this will offer many benefits and look forward to the new arrangement. The schools have been working together now for over a year and, from a day to day point of view, for you, as a parent or carer, the change will not be noticeable as it will be business as usual.

That business is of course providing our pupils with the best of learning experiences and the teachers and staff with the best of working environments and we hope that you will agree that, wherever possible, we achieve that. The governors and staff continuously monitor the performance of the school, and the pupils, both against our, and their targets and against other similar schools in Cardiff, and elsewhere in Wales, to ensure that the outcomes continue to be the best they can for our pupils. Last year, Tongwynlais again achieved the Welsh Government 'Green' school category. We aim to maintain this position from our recent categorisation meetings; we hope that this will be the case when the lists are published in January 2018.

Whilst the children only see play and learning, a lot has to be done to make and keep the school running and successfully proving that learning is fun, with all children achieving high standards. These standards and achievements are constantly being monitored and improved with the governors helping, questioning and being fully involved in maintaining the school's strong performance. In that aspect, we are pleased that the school continues to be a regional 'Professional Learning Hub' and delivers professional development programmes and training to other schools. We also continue to be a Thinking School and again this year, delivered a presentation at the 2017 national Thinking Schools' Conference.

In addition to the teaching and learning, we also have to maintain the building so that it keeps the weather out and provides a safe environment. We have some old buildings and there are always things to be done and improvements or maintenance planned. Recently, that included a new boiler and repairs to the roofs.

With the school well into preparation for the Christmas period, we are looking forward, as I know all the children are, to the usual excellent Christmas Concerts both in school and in other village celebrations and we look forward to seeing you in school.

We wish you all a lovely Christmas and look forward to a happy, healthy and successful 2018. While you enjoy the holidays, please remember the importance of the children being in school every day. Just a week away during term can affect a child's learning so for the children's benefit please see that they get to school every day.

The governors are pleased to commend this report to you. If there however are any issues raised in this report that you would like to discuss, or any other matters you wish to talk about, please raise them with the school or contact one of the governors.





## School Aims / Nodau'r Ysgol

#### We aim to:

Celebrate the **diversity** of our city and promote our rich cultural heritage and team ethos as a community school in Wales.

Enable our pupils to become caring and confident individuals, experiencing freedom of **choice**, whilst showing **respect** and **tolerance** for all.

## Pupil Attendance 2016/17

Unauthorised absences include absences for which no parental explanation is offered, where a child is absent for reasons which are not covered within the local authority's guidance or where a child is absent for family holidays during term time.

In 2016/17 our overall attendance for children of compulsory school ages was 95.4% (*not yet validated*) which sits above Cardiff and Wales averages and is a slight dip on 2015/16. The unauthorised % is not available at the time of publication.

## **School Links with the Community**

## Cysylltiadau Ysgol â'r Gymuned

The school prides itself on the strong and positive links we have within both the local and broader communities that we serve. Our school is at the heart of village life and works hard to proactively support community events and organisations.. These include the local Community Council, the 'Village Hall' group and the local churches where many of our children and their families may worship. We are, in return, wellsupported by these groups and organisations to ensure that our children develop strong and positive community values and principles. We believe we are successful in developing and extending our children's understanding of community and citizenship through these links.

We are a single-form entry school with a popular 48 'place' Nursery that has grown considerably in recent years leading into our 'over-subscribed' 28 place Reception class each year. Our Nursery and Reception classes work closely with TAG (a private, wrap-around child-care provided both onsite and in a nearby hall for before and afterschool sessions).

We also aim to ensure the smoothest transition for our Year 6 pupils as they move to the secondary school of their choice. Most children move onto Radyr Comprehensive School and this partnership is very well-established although a





number of children move onto Bishop of Llandaff each year too. Visits are planned each year, giving opportunities to attend a range of Induction Days. Liaison projects enabling pupils to undertake pieces of work which bridge primary school to high school have been very successful. Regular 'Transition Meetings' take place between teachers of all local schools on a regular basis and each school has a transition plan in place.

Local partnership working is also extended to our primary cluster with whom we work closely on various shared activities including: a range of 'learning activities' and also for the statutory End of Key Stage assessment moderation.

During the current academic year, our children have had the opportunities to engage with a very wide range of people from various agencies from within the immediate community and beyond.

Our biggest partnership however is with our parents and carers who give the school tremendous levels of support. A number of parents and 'friends of the school' regularly volunteer and help-out in classes and around the school as well as supporting after-school activities. When we have themed topics in school, we are pleased that so many parents and carers are willing to join in sharing their knowledge, skills and understanding with our children. Our highly successful **National Science Week** programme was mostly delivered by parents and carers with careers in Science or Technology. Pupils have opportunities for developing economic and industrial awareness through visits and surveys of local shops and businesses. We continue to develop our links with industry and business; such links include: Careers Wales, Recycling Projects and strong links with the Community Police Officers and School Liaison Officer, PC Durani. Our police liaison officer visits the school several times each term to work with different classes covering a range of topics around personal and social well-being.

Our school choir has an excellent musical reputation with a long and rich background. It involves many children of all ages in a range of musical events and activities that include: performing at the Whitchurch and Tongwynlais Festivals and Christmas concerts in both the church and village hall. We see the musical skills learnt in school as a direct link to a community that is very proud of its well-established of its tradition including the local choral society and brass band.

Our popular weekly Gardening Club is run by local community members and contributes to the vibrancy of village life by producing the hanging baskets around the village during the summer months. We also take part in the annual RHS Cardiff show and the children are supported by parents to produce a themed wheelbarrow for the exhibiton.

The school recognises the immense value of the

community capital that such events and activities generate and are pleased and proud to work with our neighbours and many local partners including the Tongwynlais Community Council, Wales and West Housing Association and local businesses.

School Governors with specialist skills and knowledge support the school's work and parents and helpers from the community regularly help in the classroom and beyond. Our Friends of Tongwynlais Primary are also extremely well-supported, proactive and raising much appreciated funds for the school and the children. In recent years, the Friends have



purchased play and PE equipment, staging and iPads for the school.

Our partnership work as an accredited 'Thinking School' means that 'Thinking Schools International' regularly send parties of visiting teachers to work alongside our staff and children and observe how they develop and apply their use of Thinking Maps, Habits of Mind and 'Thinking Hats' to support learning. Most recently the school has also led two training days for colleagues from other schools as well as delivered at national conference.

As well as offering one-to-one support for pupils with 'statements of special educational needs', the school operates a system of early identification of educational learning needs and provides a well-planned programme of early intervention and support programmes to learners. Current programmes include literacy interventions, WellComm, SAIL, Speech and Language Links, Rapid Readers and Rainbow Readers, Toe-by-Toe and PAT for spelling; Catch-up Numeracy and NIPpers for maths. The school also offers 'Spirals' for younger children and a ELSA programme (Emotional Literacy) in order to build social skills, confidence, self-esteem and to offer direct 1:1 or small group support for children as needed.

Most pupils show significant and accelerated progress as a result of these learning interventions and make good within year' progress. When progress is not as rapid as expected then the school is able to draw on outside expertise for specific advice and support for the children.

Welsh Cymraeg We are an English medium primary school with very few children coming from a family where a parent speaks Welsh in the family home. Welsh language skills have a high priority in our school and learning to speak Welsh has been an ongoing development priority for staff as well as the children in recent years. All children, from Nursery to Year 6, learn Welsh as part of the Foundation Phase Orders and National

Curriculum for KS2. All children have Welsh Language lessons and the opportunity to practise their oral Welsh skills on a daily basis in the class. We work closely with our Athrowas Fro who visits the school to support and develop teaching and learning in Welsh as a second language. In 2014 the school introduced a new programme of work for Welsh into school which has been developed by the Central South Consortium to meet the needs of children and teachers to ensure teaching is consistent, progressive and suitably challenging for all across the school and between schools. By the end of 2015 we were already seeing a positive impact on raising standards in Oracy in Welsh. 'Listening to Learners' which is carried out on pupils in Year 2, 4 and 6 by a third party, shows progress is consistently 'at least' good across the school by the end of 2016/17 with



measurable progress being consistently recorded within the year.

We also recognise the need for children to practise these new language skills and we routinely use incidental Welsh through the school day. We have the 'Cwestiwn y Pythefnos' (question of the fortnight) which is used to encourage the children to use Welsh at home and as well as in school. Other areas of the curriculum, such as history and geography, music and art, also offer opportunities to share an understanding of Welsh culture and customs, history and traditions.

Staff use incidental Welsh when talking with children and each other around the school and staff (including both teachers and teaching assistants) have benefitted from attending extended Welsh second Language training courses which have been paid for by Welsh Government. The have ranged in length from one week to several months to ensure the children have the opportunity to learn Welsh in a setting where the Welsh Language is promoted.



## Toilet Provision and Cleanliness Tŷ Bach

We provide all members of our school community with the appropriate access (and clean, adequate facilities to encourage them) to the school toilets and to enable them to wash their hands thoroughly afterwards. The school provides the basics of liquid soap, warm water and paper towels to ensure hand hygiene compliance and posters are displayed to encourage good personal hygiene habits. The number of toilets available meets Welsh Government recommendations. All toilets are cleaned on a daily basis by Local Authority cleaners and the physical environment is well-maintained to ensure that the toilet environment meets the needs of all our children and adults. All

statutory "Health and Safety" checks are made in respect of the toilet area.
